Sign Code Revisions in Effect

After three years of public process, the City Council approved revisions to the Sign Code (Ordinance 3012) on September 7, 2010 which came into effect on September 22, 2010.



Staff is committed to actively informing the business community about the code changes. Staff will first meet with representatives of the Chamber of Commerce and Main Street to discuss revisions and the proposed enforcement strategy, and then visit business owners in the following areas:

- 1. Upper Sims Way to Haines Street Beginning September 27, 2010
- 2. Historic District Beginning October 25, 2010

Beginning in January 2011, business owners in other areas will be contacted with information about the new regulations.

What does this mean for your business?

Staff will be reviewing existing files to identify legally permitted signage. If you are a business with a legally established sandwich board sign in the Historic District, staff will need current proof of liability insurance. All signs must be in good repair and function. If you have a sign, you may want to check your records for your sign permit. If you cannot locate your sign permit, need more information, or have sign questions please contact Suzanne Wassmer at 385-0644 or swassmer@cityofpt.us.
